DDOT Debuts Online Public Space Occupancy Map

(Washington, DC) The District Department of Transportation (DDOT) announced an online tool to help residents, visitors and businesses view activities that are impeding pedestrian, cyclist and vehicular traffic in the District.

DDOT's [Public Space Occupancy Map](#) displays existing construction projects, emergency utility work and special events. Icons that represent activities that are temporarily affecting public space display various details when selected (for example, public space permit numbers and beginning and end dates for a project or special event), allowing users to examine the activities in greater detail.

Data for the map is pulled from DDOT's [Transportation Online Permitting System](#) (TOPS) and ProTrack (DDOT project tracking) databases.
