DDOT Introduces Small Cell Installation Map

Washington, D.C. – Today, the District Department of Transportation (DDOT), Public Space Regulation Division, launched an [interactive real-time map](#), which captures Small Cell technology around the District of Columbia. The map shows the real time location and supporting data regarding the deployment and installation of 5G Small Cell technology.

Small Cell attachments are wireless transmitters and receivers created to provide network coverage closer to the end-user at street level. It is widely becoming a component of wireless densification and new 5G networks, especially in densely populated areas. Currently, there are three Master License Agreement (MLA) holders (AT&T, Crown Castle and Verizon), authorized to install Small Cells throughout the District.

The interactive map can be accessed at the following link, <https://arcg.is/00m408>. The MLA holders are represented as follows on the map: AT&T (blue), Crown Castle (green) and Verizon (red). Users can search the map in the following four ways:

1. TOPS Permit Numbers
2. TOPS Tracking Numbers
3. Full home addresses
4. Roadway Intersections

DDOT created a training document demonstrating how to navigate the map to assist all users with a positive navigation experience.
