Suspension of Work in the District of Columbia

Observance of Memorial Day Monday, May 27, 2019

In observance of Memorial Day and pursuant to section 103.01 Article 17 item C of the District's Standard Specifications for Highways and Structures, there will be a suspension of work in the District from 12 p.m., Friday, May 24 through Monday, May 27, 2019. **Lane closures and work zones will not be allowed for non-emergency work in roadways, alleys and sidewalks within the District's right of way.** This includes manhole access and construction-related deliveries.

Approved activities may resume Tuesday, May 28, during permitted work hours.

Per DDOT standard practice, exemptions will be allowed for cause in limited cases during this suspension of work. Exemptions must be requested by Tuesday, May 21, 2019. Exemption requests must be made in writing to Stacey Collins, Chief of Inspection and Enforcement, via email at Stacey.Collins@dc.gov with the following in the subject line, "2019 Memorial Day Exemption Request."

The exemption request must include the following information:

- Public space permit number(s) for the work zone, including construction and occupancy permits
- Location of work zone
- Day(s) and hour(s) for the exemption
- Nature/phase of work taking place during exemption
- Basis/rationale for the exemption
- 24-hour emergency contact name, phone number, and email address
